**1** But Job<sup>H347</sup> answered<sup>H6030</sup> and said<sup>H559</sup>, **2** Oh that<sup>H3863</sup> my grief<sup>H3708</sup> were throughly<sup>H8254</sup> weighed<sup>H8254</sup>, and my calamity<sup>H1942 H1962</sup> laid<sup>H5375</sup> in the balances<sup>H3976</sup> together<sup>H3162</sup>!<sup>1</sup> **3** For now it would be heavier<sup>H3513</sup> than the sand<sup>H2344</sup> of the sea<sup>H3220</sup>: therefore my words<sup>H1697</sup> are swallowed up<sup>H3886</sup>.<sup>2</sup> **4** For the arrows<sup>H2671</sup> of the Almighty<sup>H7706</sup> are within<sup>H5978</sup> me, the poison<sup>H2534</sup> whereof drinketh up<sup>H8354</sup> my spirit<sup>H7307</sup>: the terrors<sup>H1161</sup> of God<sup>H433</sup> do set themselves in array<sup>H6186</sup> against me. **5** Doth the wild ass<sup>H6501</sup> bray<sup>H5101</sup> when he hath grass<sup>H1877</sup>? or loweth<sup>H1600</sup> the ox<sup>H7794</sup> over his fodder<sup>H1098</sup>?<sup>3</sup> **6** Can that which is unsavoury<sup>H8602</sup> be eaten<sup>H398</sup> without salt<sup>H4417</sup>? or is there<sup>H3426</sup> any taste<sup>H2940</sup> in the white<sup>H7388</sup> of an egg<sup>H2495</sup>? **7** The things that my soul<sup>H5315</sup> refused<sup>H3985</sup> to touch<sup>H5060</sup> are as my sorrowful<sup>H1741</sup> meat<sup>H3899</sup>.

**8** Oh that I might have<sup>H935</sup> my request<sup>H7596</sup>; and that God<sup>H433</sup> would grant<sup>H5414</sup> me the thing that I long for<sup>H8615</sup>!<sup>4</sup> **9** Even that it would please<sup>H2974</sup> God<sup>H433</sup> to destroy<sup>H1792</sup> me; that he would let loose<sup>H5425</sup> his hand<sup>H3027</sup>, and cut me off<sup>H1214</sup>! **10** Then should I yet have comfort<sup>H5165</sup>; yea, I would harden<sup>H5539</sup> myself in sorrow<sup>H2427</sup>: let him not spare<sup>H2550</sup>; for I have not concealed<sup>H3582</sup> the words<sup>H561</sup> of the Holy One<sup>H6918</sup>. **11** What is my strength<sup>H3581</sup>, that I should hope<sup>H3176</sup>? and what is mine end<sup>H7093</sup>, that I should prolong<sup>H748</sup> my life<sup>H5315</sup>? **12** Is my strength<sup>H3581</sup> the strength<sup>H3581</sup> of stones<sup>H68</sup>? or is my flesh<sup>H1320</sup> of brass<sup>H5153</sup>?<sup>5</sup> **13** Is not my help<sup>H5833</sup> in me? and is wisdom<sup>H8454</sup> driven quite<sup>H5080</sup> from me?

**14** To him that is afflicted<sup>H4523</sup> pity<sup>H2617</sup> should be shewed from his friend<sup>H7453</sup>; but he forsaketh<sup>H5800</sup> the fear<sup>H3374</sup> of the Almighty<sup>H7706.6</sup> **15** My brethren<sup>H251</sup> have dealt deceitfully<sup>H898</sup> as a brook<sup>H5158</sup>, and as the stream<sup>H650</sup> of brooks<sup>H5158</sup> they pass away<sup>H5674</sup>; **16** Which are blackish<sup>H6937</sup> by reason of the ice<sup>H7140</sup>, and wherein the snow<sup>H7950</sup> is hid<sup>H5956</sup>: **17** What time<sup>H6256</sup> they wax warm<sup>H2215</sup>, they vanish<sup>H6789</sup>: when it is hot<sup>H2527</sup>, they are consumed out<sup>H1846</sup> of their place<sup>H4725,789</sup> **18** The paths<sup>H734</sup> of their way<sup>H1870</sup> are turned aside<sup>H3943</sup>; they go<sup>H5927</sup> to nothing<sup>H8414</sup>, and perish<sup>H6</sup>. **19** The troops<sup>H734</sup> of Tema<sup>H8485</sup> looked<sup>H5027</sup>, the companies<sup>H1979</sup> of Sheba<sup>H7614</sup> waited<sup>H6960</sup> for them. **20** They were confounded<sup>H954</sup> because they had hoped<sup>H982</sup>; they came<sup>H335</sup> thither, and were ashamed<sup>H2659</sup>. **21** For now ye are nothing; ye see<sup>H7200</sup> my casting down<sup>H2866</sup>, and are afraid<sup>H3372,1011</sup>

**22** Did I say<sup>H559</sup>, Bring<sup>H3051</sup> unto me? or, Give a reward<sup>H7809</sup> for me of your substance<sup>H3581</sup>? **23** Or, Deliver<sup>H4422</sup> me from the enemy's<sup>H6862</sup> hand<sup>H3027</sup>? or, Redeem<sup>H6299</sup> me from the hand<sup>H3027</sup> of the mighty<sup>H6184</sup>? **24** Teach<sup>H3384</sup> me, and I will hold my tongue<sup>H2790</sup>: and cause me to understand<sup>H995</sup> wherein I have erred<sup>H7686</sup>. **25** How forcible<sup>H4834</sup> are right<sup>H3476</sup> words<sup>H561</sup>! but what doth your arguing<sup>H3198</sup> reprove<sup>H3198</sup>? **26** Do ye imagine<sup>H2803</sup> to reprove<sup>H3198</sup> words<sup>H4405</sup>, and the speeches<sup>H561</sup> of one that is desperate<sup>H2976</sup>, which are as wind<sup>H7307</sup>? **27** Yea, ye overwhelm<sup>H5307</sup> the fatherless<sup>H3490</sup>, and ye dig<sup>H3738</sup> a pit for your friend<sup>H7453</sup>.<sup>12</sup> **28** Now therefore be content<sup>H2974</sup>, look<sup>H6437</sup> upon me; for it is evident<sup>H6440</sup> unto you if I lie<sup>H3576</sup>.<sup>13</sup> **29** Return<sup>H7725</sup>, I pray you, let it not be iniquity<sup>H5766</sup>; yea, return again<sup>H7725</sup>, my righteousness<sup>H6664</sup> is in it.<sup>14</sup> **30** Is there<sup>H3426</sup> iniquity<sup>H5766</sup> in my tongue<sup>H3956</sup>? cannot my taste<sup>H2441</sup> discern<sup>H995</sup> perverse things<sup>H1942</sup>?<sup>15</sup>
